$|\Delta y|$

The figure displays two panels. The top panel shows the gap fraction as a function of $|\Delta y|$ for 7000 GeV pp collisions. The data points are from ATLAS (black squares) and are compared against Herwig++ 2.7.1 default (orange dashed line with open circles) and Herwig 7.2.1 default (green dashed line with open squares).
